Linking health and local authority services through the One Public Estate Programme in Nottingham

The challenge:

Across the LIFT estate in mid and south Nottinghamshire there is almost £1.5 million (per annum) of bookable space which is largely unused and these costs are being passed to Clinical Commissioning Groups (CCGs).

The opportunity:

Through CHPs Strategic Estate Planning (SEP) work, local CCGs have gained an understanding that the mitigation of the bulk of this cost can be driven by partner engagement, partnership working and collaborative estate planning across localities.

CHP is now acting as the link between Health and Nottinghamshire's One Public Estate programme (driven by Nottinghamshire City Council) and a commitment has already been gained from all stakeholders to collaborate, share estate information and plans.

On a practical level this means that all CHP and NHS Property Service assets have now been plotted on Nottinghamshire's One Public Estates estate mapping software; enabling a strategic approach to be taken to the utilisation and planning of the shared health and local authority estate across the county – with the aim of delivering critical estate savings.
